**Public Transport:** DART (train) from Connolly Station Dublin. Journey approx 45 minutes  
Bus Route 145, from Heuston Station Dublin, Journey approx 1 hour

**Road:** N11/ M11 Southbound  
Exit at junction 6 for Bray

**Cycling** is a wonderful way to experience the beauty of Wicklow landscapes. Hire a bike from the Tourist Office and take a self guided route or book a guided ride with Cycling Holidays Ireland. Bray is perfect for **walking** enthusiast of all abilities, with signposted Town and Coastal Walking Routes. Try the Avoca Tours Walking App for the Bray Town Heritage Trail or Bray Cliff Walk routes with digital maps and audio guides. Visit the Wicklow Mountains National Park and choose one of the 9 way-marked walking trails in the valley of Glendalough.

For the **adventurous**, climb the Sugarloaf Mountain or kayak along the coast. There's plenty for the children too: visit SEA LIFE Aquarium, Bray Bowl, Star Leisure or catch the entertainment at one of the many festivals that Bray hosts: Bray Summerfest, Bray Jazz Festival, Yarn festival of story and song, or the St Patrick's Festival and there is so much more! ## Top Ten Things To Do in Bray



The Cliff Walk takes you 7 kilometers from Bray to Greystones along the stunning coastal path and takes about 2 hours. The path is well maintained and you can return by rail (DART) to Bray.



Bray's Victorian Promenade starts in the harbour area near Martello Terrace, the former home of James Joyce. It is a mile in length with views of Bray Head and Sugarloaf Mountains.



East Coast Kayaks use sit on top kayaks to explore the many beautiful locations that Bray and Wicklow have to offer - Bray Harbour, the Dargle River and the cove at Bray Head.



The National SEA LIFE Centre is a perfect family fun day out. An aquatic Zoo with 30+ displays, home to over 1,000 sea creatures, takes you on a journey of the deep...without getting wet!



Killruddery Estate is home to one of Ireland's great historic houses. Take a tour of the stately home, explore the gardens, and then have tea in the Garden Café.
