Item 1

**Confirmation of minutes of the Ordinary Meeting of
Municipal District of Bray dated 4th October 2022**

Councillor O'Connor proposed the confirmation of the minutes of the ordinary meeting of the Municipal District of Bray held 4th October 2022. Councillor Ferris seconded the proposal and they were unanimously agreed by the Members

Item 2**To consider the Draft Budgetary Plan for the Municipal District of Bray for the financial year ending 31st December 2023**

The District Manager, Ms Lorraine Gallagher advised that the draft municipal budgetary plan was issued to the Members. Ms Gallagher advised that this was the second part in a four part budgetary process, she explained that the draft municipal budget must be adopted by the Members before going forward to the full Council budget meeting on the 28th November. Following on from the outcome of the budget meeting a full schedule of works for the District will be adopted.

The Draft Budgetary Plan for the Municipal District of Bray for the financial year ending 31st December 2023 was proposed by Councillor Flynn Kennedy and seconded by Councillor Ferris

The Elected Members raised the following concerns and observations

Cllr McManus raised the issue of funding for relets. Ms Gallagher advised that this would be a matter for the budgetary meeting of the main Council, not a matter for Bray MD

The Cathaoirleach enquired if the process could be simplified or if members could get some help to understand the process ahead of next year's budget.

Item 3 To receive an update on 2022 discretionary funding projects

The District Engineer, updated members on works carried out to date on the 2022 discretionary projects.

Footpath Works: He advised that the majority of funding last year was allocated to footpath repairs, that programme of works is 80% complete with the remaining works expected to be finished by the end of the year.

Bray Head: An ecologist has been engaged for the preparation of a Conservation Management Plan for Bray Head. The ecologist is also being engaged to prepare an appropriate assessment screening report for the trail proposals at Raheen Park. Drawings outlining the trail proposals were presented to the SAAO committee.

A separate consultant has been engaged to prepare a NeighbourWood Scheme Plan for Bray Head with a view to applying for additional funding. A draft NeighbourWood Scheme Plan has been prepared.

A meeting was held between Wicklow County Council, the ecologist preparing the Conservation Management Plan and the consultant preparing the NeighbourWood Scheme Plan to coordinate and progress plans. It was agreed the draft NeighbourWood Scheme plan will be updated once the Conservation Management Plan is prepared.

Electric Vehicle Chargers: The District Engineer informed members that there may be the possibility of another contractor taking these over through a third party agreement with Eir.

Seafront Seating: Executive Engineer, Mr Stephen Fox informed members that this process was still being examined in order to decide whether it was better to carry out the works in situ or to demount the seating and carry out the works off site.

Victorian Shelters: Mr Fox advised that a lot of work had gone on in the background trying to source the metal work needed for this project. Talks had taken place with a contractor in the UK but due to Brexit this might make it very expensive. He is now looking for a different contractor.

Men's Toilet Seafront: The refurbishment of these toilets was completed during the year.

Ladies Toilet Seafront: These works will be progressing shortly, they are currently out to tender.

The Elected Members raised the following concerns and observations

Members acknowledged the importance of the Victorian shelters from a heritage perspective but raised concerns around the potential growing cost of refurbishing them.

The District Manager advised that the option of funding through the Department of Heritage could be examined.

Item 4 To receive a presentation from the District Engineer on proposed discretionary funding projects for 2023

The Cathaoirleach read out the 2023 discretionary funding proposals below. She detailed the process advising members that they first look to the engineering staff for their suggestions and input and then turn to the elected members for their proposals and views. She stated that any decisions she made were as part of her position of Cathaoirleach and not as an elected member.

The Cathaoirleach advised that while some of the projects that had been proposed were not on the final list, they will be referred to other departments in Wicklow County Council for consideration. She thanked the members for their input into the process.

Mr Gillan spoke to members about the suggested proposals for Quinsborough Road. He stated that Quinsborough Road is a great boulevard which offers a fantastic opportunity to create a connection from the Seafront to the Main Street. He noted that the NTA would be supportive of the proposal, in line with their upgrade of the plaza at the DART station but that the engineering staff wanted to get the elected members point of view on how they would like to see the street develop.

In relation to the Community Landscape Grant proposal he advised they were trying to encourage residents to get involved in the enhancement of their areas, improve cohesiveness of communities and take pride in the area they live in and the Council are willing to support them in their proposals.

The District Engineer advised that in relation to the beach accessibility proposal it would be necessary to engage a marine specialist as this is a difficult environment to find a solution to.

The Elected Members raised the following concerns and observations

The elected members thanked the Cathaoirleach for her time and effort in the discretionary funding process and for the work involved in drawing up the final proposal list.

Members discussed how the proposals they put forward were representative of issues that their constituents had raised with them during the year.

Courthouse on Boghall Road has the potential to be a superb, widely used community space. Leader funding would be of great advantage for renovating this building.

Bins/dog poo bins are needed on the Southern Cross & Boghall Roads

Welcomed funding for the playground in Enniskerry – Application for Leader funding can now progress

Involvement of young people in relation to the Quinsborough Road proposal.

Going forward perhaps the process could be carried out in a different format, where each idea gets time and consideration.

Cathaoirleach acknowledged it's not a perfect process, but that the proposals are from the elected members and there are pros and cons to voting on every individual project

Ms Gallagher thanked the elected members for their ideas and involvement in the process. She thanked the Cathaoirleach for all her work on the preparation of the final list. She stated that everyone works as a team and that the door is always open to the members. All works on the list will be undertaken and carried out.

The Cathaoirleach proposed the adoption of the Discretionary Funding projects for 2023 and Councillor Flynn Kennedy seconded it.

Item 5 To receive a presentation on the Review of Town Teams from Ms. Christine Flood, Senior Executive Officer, Economic Development

Ms. Flood gave members an update on the Review of Town Teams. Information was also provided on:

- The Town Centre First (TCF) policy which aims to create town centres that function as viable, vibrant and attractive locations for people to live.
- Each town will develop their own TCF plan which will be driven by the community and business as part of a Town Team to be supported by a Town Regeneration Officer (TRO) and technical expertise from each local authority.
- The role of the Town Regeneration Officer.
- Key findings of the Town Team Review
- Recommendations

The Elected Members raised the following concerns and observations

Need to be mindful of the undermining of the role of the elected member
Ensure Town Teams are not given information ahead of the elected members
Communication, collaboration and definition of roles is very important
Council/MD needs to be the driver leading development in towns.
Elected members should be the chair of the Town Team
Elected members are responsible and are answerable to the public.
Town Team is a supporting role
They are a great way to get people involved in the community and to capture a broad range of ideas
Training dimension is welcomed
Will members have a say in the CLG
Incorporates the entire district, not just the main town area
Sub committees to cover smaller areas.
Importance of including young people
Keep numbers to a reasonable size
Important that members are reported back to
Keep an open mind but a watchful eye
Important to keep balance

Ms Gallagher thanked Ms Flood for her presentation and the elected members for their comments. She advised that all views would be taken away and looked at by Wicklow County Council. A Town Regeneration Officer would be appointed soon. Communication and collaboration is key.

Item 6 To consider the Housing Report

Cedar Court

Construction is ongoing with the units due for completion in Q1 of 2023.

Parnell Road (Central Garage site)

Initially Tuath Approved Housing Body had concerns due to the costs of the project and applied for both CALF and CAS funding to ascertain which model would best support the rapidly rising costs. There were difficulties over the last 18 months securing reliable costings due to the considerable uncertainties in the market with some costs changing weekly. Tuath are now in the process of submitting a revised CALF which we are awaiting.

Kilbride Lodge and Sutton Villas.

We are still awaiting registration of the land so the developments can proceed.

Rehills Lands

The Department and NDFA are proceeding with the appointment of consultants for the scheme.

Fassaroe.

We hope to lodge the part 8 shortly.

Southern Cross Road.

A development of 208 houses and apartments, including 20 Part V units, is in the process of being purchased for social housing as a turnkey by Cooperative Housing Ireland. The first units have been delivered and all units should be complete by Q4 of 2022.

The Elected Members raised the following concerns and observations

Update on Loreto Convent being used as a Ukrainian Hub

Conservatory at convent – support for restoration works

Timeframe on vacant housing officer position

Update on boarded up houses in Fassaroe

Funding shortfall for re-lets – will disproportionately affect Bray. Housing Minister indicated that funding for re-lets is not an issue.

Cold weather initiative – can elected members be kept up to date re processes and information.

Mr. Hickey advised that in relation to the Loreto convent being used as a Ukrainian Hub, these works had gone to tender.

Mr Hickey recommended that the conservation group get in contact with the housing department in Wicklow County Council. At present only the internal structure is being looked at.

3 houses in Fassaroe will be allocated shortly. 3 other units require works costing over €100,000.00 which there is no budget for.

There is huge pressure in relation to budgets for re-lets. The Director of Services for housing is looking to the Department of Housing for additional funding.

Bray MD housing section will be working in partnership with 5 loaves and BCAT on the cold weather initiative.

Mr Hickey advised he will follow up on the position of vacant housing officer.

Following tendering in April, a contractor was pointed to carry out a schedule of concrete footpath repairs. To date, approximately 80% of the footpath programme has been completed. Recording of additional defects is on-going and priorities may be amended. Own labour charged to road maintenance will be used to supplement the budget to complete as much of the required repairs as possible this year.

Drainage Works

Essential drainage repairs and improvements are on-going. Substantial drainage works were recently completed at Killough Lower and works planned at Ballybawn last year were also recently completed.

The District Engineer advised that he has made contact with all landowners in relation to the flooding on Quill Road and would prioritise funding for these works next year.

Mr Gillan advised members that he was aware that a section of the works on Quinsborough Road would need to be resurfaced. This will be done. He advised that the level of the road was appropriate and there was no risk of flooding to adjacent retailers.

The disability parking space in the Bogmeadow was put beside the EV chargers to facilitate people with disabilities in using the chargers. This can be looked at.

The signage for age friendly parking is standard – the District Engineer advised that he used larger text on the signs but as the signs have no legal status people are parking in them like regular parking spaces.

Bray Central

District Administrator, Ms Linda Healy informed members that the carpark was now open, as were two of the restaurants. No further details were available.

Bray Harbour Improvement Scheme

The requirement for additional environmental assessments was identified in the draft Feasibility Report. RPS was requested to carry out an EIA Scoping Exercise as an add-on to their current engagement. A draft EIA has been reviewed and approved. This identifies all of the potential environmental impacts that needs to be addressed in the EIAR. A Stage 1 Screening for an Appropriate Assessment report has yet to be provided after which it is proposed to organise further public consultation that includes a 3D visualisation of the proposed scheme.

Outdoor performance space Bray Seafront

Mr. Fox told members that since the appointment of a design architect in February they have been in discussions with various consultants to find a design to meet the needs of all the various stakeholders. Currently they are looking at a stretched tent like covering that could be in place for a few months but also be removed as needed. There was a meeting 3 weeks ago with the architect and a supplier of these coverings, they have come back with a design this week. The next step is to see if the design is appropriate and then present to the elected members.

Ms Gallagher informed members that the deadline for the grant funding for this project has been extended to September 2023.

Item 10 Notice of Motions

1. Notice of Motion in the Name of Councillor Rory O'Connor (13/09/22)

This council invite both a TFI and Go Ahead Ireland representative in to give a presentation about our bus services.

This Motion was seconded by Councillor Flynn Kennedy.

Following a brief discussion the members agreed to invite TFI and Go Ahead representatives to a future meeting.

Ms Healy advised she will write to TFI & Go Ahead Ireland.

The Cathaoirleach advised that Go Ahead Ireland had been before the Oireachtas Committee on Transport recently in relation to the service it is providing.

It was agreed that replies to the remaining Notice of Motions would be forwarded to the elected members by email. It was further agreed that any member who wished their Notice to be included for discussion on the December Agenda would advise the District Administrator.

Item 11 Correspondence

Councillor Behan asked the District Administrator if she had received correspondence from the Skatepark Proximity Residents group.

Ms Healy confirmed she had received correspondence from the Skatepark Proximity Residents group in relation to the proposed skate park at Gilspurt Heights and advised that a reply had issued.

Item 12 Any Other Business.
